



What You Always Wanted to Know About ATVs But Were Afraid to Ask!

“An **all-terrain vehicle (ATV)**, also known as a **light utility vehicle (LUV)**, a **quad bike**, or simply a **quad**, as defined by the [American National Standards Institute \(ANSI\)](#); is a vehicle that travels on low-pressure tires, with a seat that is straddled by the operator, along with handlebars for steering control. As the name implies, it is designed to handle a wider variety of terrain than most other vehicles. Although it is a [street-legal vehicle](#) in some countries, it is not street-legal within most states, territories, and provinces of [Australia](#), the [United States](#) or [Canada](#).” – Wikipedia

Generally ATVs are built for the use of a single driver. A rider straddles the engine and sits on top like a motorcycle. Instead of two wheels, the operator has four wheels which give extra stability at lower speeds. Actually, most ATVs can have three or four wheels. In the United States ATVs generally range from 49 to 1,000 cc (3.0 to 61 cu in). Some people haul their ATVs on a trailer and some use large pick-up trucks.

Best Practices for Selling a Used ATV

As many of us know far too well, the job market is tough, and many of us are looking for some extra cash. If this is the case for you, or if you're just looking to get some extra money for something new and shiny, you may be considering selling your ATV. It might hurt to let your baby go, but enthusiasts are often willing to shell out some serious cash for a nice used ATV. Notice the keyword there: nice! A beat up old thing will probably steer potential buyers away from the pictures alone. On top of that, knowledgeable buyers may very well ask to take a test run. Such knowledgeable buyers are probably the ones who will be willing to pay the most of top-quality equipment. With all of this in mind, you'll want to make sure your ride is in the best shape possible before you start posting ads. Fortunately, following a few best practices will make this easy enough, while helping you to bring in as much money as possible.

General Upkeep

The first thing you'll need to do is make sure your used ATV is in prime functioning condition. Examine the frame for rust, as this could indicate a crack. Cracks can be fixed by some simple welding by a mechanic, and the repairs should be fairly inexpensive. Check CV joint boots for cracks and general wear and tear. Use a flashlight to look in the gas tank for rust, and check to see if the oil is contaminated (it'll look thick and discolored if so). Check all of your tires for worn bearings by moving them from side to side, and replace them if necessary. Remove the seat, take the air box lid off, and make sure it's clean and dry. Make sure that all front and rear sprockets are straight and uniform with no wear and tear, and test the breaks to see that they're not sticking. Check the exhaust pipe and ensure that there's a spark arrestor. Finally, make sure the tires are fairly fresh.

Remember: everyone who looks at your used ATV knows that it is... well, used. Anybody who's looking for perfect quality will likely be willing to spend the money for a new one, so don't worry too much about perfection. The key to everything above is to make sure that everything is in working order and to fix any damages to the structural integrity before selling it off. Not only is it common courtesy, but it will also ensure that an experienced rider won't be put off by unnecessary wear and tear upon inspection.

Appearance

Once your vehicle is structurally fit for sale, you'll want to make it pretty for the pictures. First off, remove any stickers you've put on over the years. Buff out or repaint any scratches on the body and replace torn seat cushions or broken plastic. Give your used ATV a good wash, and oil chains and gears.

Once again, a good appearance is key. As they say, a picture is worth a thousand words. With the tips above, you should be able to get a good offer on your used ATV.

How to Care for Your 50cc ATV

The ATV is only as reliable as its owner. Like other forms of vehicles or means of transportation, a 50cc ATV needs consistent maintenance and upkeep. The better the care, the more reliable your 50cc ATV will be; the more fun you will have riding it and the more trust you will have in it.

Some people think that maintaining a 50cc ATV is difficult and complicated but this is far from the truth. The only difficult part is when you're learning to do it; once you've climbed this little hill, everything will be very easy and painless from then on. If regular maintenance is performed, it gets easier and faster every time.

Let it be known that there are some important parts of your 50cc ATV that needs careful checkup regularly. For instance, the air filter, oil and oil filter, tire pressure, nuts and bolts. These are some of the major components that will affect the overall performance of your 50cc ATV. Experts agree that although this is not all there is to check when performing maintenance on your 50cc ATV, checking these important parts should help keep your vehicle in relatively good condition over a long period of time.

Among those mentioned, the air filter on your 50cc ATV is one of the most important components on your vehicle. Dust is everywhere and it will collect in the filter; if you don't regularly clean it, it can and will become clogged. The air filter is your 50cc ATV's lungs. And if it is clogged, your 50cc ATV will find it hard to breathe. An ATV with 50cc cannot perform up to mark if it cannot breathe! Thankfully, however, that the air filter is one of the easiest parts to clean or change. It depends on the type, brand, quality

and material of the air filter on your 50cc ATV but most air filters can be removed and changed without using any tools whatsoever.

Clean oil is also very important to the overall performance of the vehicle - in fact, if the oil is never cleaned, it might even cause major problems in the 50cc ATV! Repair or replacement could be your answer if that is so. To prevent that from ever happening, you will need to check or change the oil to make sure that the oil is not contaminated. To make sure the 50cc ATV runs smoothly, here's a tip....change the oil and oil filter every beginning and end of spring and fall. If the 50cc ATV is going to be in storage for the whole winter, change the oil BEFORE you put it into storage. This works pretty much the same way for other vehicles like your car and motorcycles. Just drain and replace the oil according to the manufacturer's direction.

As for tire pressure, make sure you check the pressure on the tire of your ATV every month. To complete the maintenance process, make sure all nuts and bolts on the 50cc ATV is tight. A quick look is not enough! Make sure they're completely tight because you don't want parts falling off when you're riding it, do you?

How to Enhance Your ATV Boot's Life

ATV's have two very noticeable characteristics - sleek attractive designs and amazing speeds. They are the center of attraction wherever they are and anyone who has been on one instantly becomes an admirer and an ATV enthusiast. However an ATV's performance goes hand in hand with its maintenance and upkeep. In this article we will focus our attention on ATV boots which are an integral part of such machines. ATV boots help in maneuverability by negotiating steep turns and tough terrains. Here we will list a few tips that ATV owners can use to enhance its life.

- Clean the Chassis after Use

ATV's are meant to be used aggressively and on rough muddy terrains and deserts. As a result, they tend to get very dirty. Many ATV owners tend to keep their ATV dirty showing it off as a sign that their rig has been tested to the extreme. The better practice would be to thoroughly clean and wash the chassis under the vehicle. ATVs can handle mud well however any foreign particles that might get stuck in the mud can and will cause problems for boots in the long run. Cleaning the chassis from underneath ensures that such a problem never occurs.

- Regular Inspection on a Timely Basis

This doesn't just apply to ATV boots specifically. The entire ATV should be carefully inspected from time to time to ensure all parts are working in optimal condition. The ATV will begin to show signs of wear and tear over time, especially the boot of the ATV. Manual inspection under the chassis

will point out any parts that require immediate attention and can save the owner from costly repairs in the long run.

- Avoid Generic ATV Boots

Original manufacture parts are expensive but they are more durable and long lasting. They also carry the manufacture warranty and can be replaced if the product does not live up to its expectations. ATV boots are no different. It is advisable to only use parts recommended by the ATV manufacturer. True that the generic ones are indeed significantly cheaper but their quality is also significantly lower and they are much more prone to wear and tear than the original ones.


- Pay Attention to Any Signs of Malfunction

ATV boots will show visible signs of malfunction. Users should pick up on that and take it to a certified mechanic immediately. In most instances the boot of an ATV can be repaired if the malfunctioning symptoms are caught early on and the damage is not severe. Ignoring these signs altogether puts the ATV and the user at risk as the ATV boot might eventually give out causing the ATV joints to snap and break.

As a general rule of thumb, proper inspection and maintenance is a guaranteed way for prolonging the life of an ATV boot. ATVs repairs are expensive. A little preventative maintenance goes a long way in prolonging your rig.
